## Summary of the Graduate Student Survey

The Graduate Student Survey was designed to gather opinions of currently enrolled graduate students related to various components of their educational experiences as graduate students at the University of South Alabama. The Graduate Student Survey was administered electronically using the Qualtrics survey system. The survey included Likert scale, multiple choice, and open-ended items. The survey launched on October 16, 2010, and closed on November 13, 2020. Participation was voluntary and reminder emails were sent out once a week on Fridays before the close of the survey.

## Sample

The sample consisted of graduate students who were enrolled in the Fall 2020 semester. In total, there were 5,175 graduate students; 1,091 students responded to the survey for a response rate of 21%. Respondent demographics are displayed in the tables below (n = number of respondents).
